University Avenue Construction

Spring is here so it must be construction season. This time it is on University Avenue in front of Dale Heights Church.

We have been told it will not be pretty but a real effort is being made to make sure we can get to our destination during construction. University Avenue will remain open to traffic during construction. At least one lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained throughout the project. Temporary turn lanes and temporary signals will be provided at signalized intersections.

Left turns will only be allowed where left turn lanes are provided. University Avenue at Norman Way will not have a signal so you will not be allowed to make a left turn in or out of Norman Way. Please plan to always turn right. Possible routes for those coming from the east (downtown Madison) would be Old Middleton Road and right onto Norman Way (a one way road that ends its one way at Dale Heights) or onto Capital where you can make a right onto University Avenue. For those who want to go toward Middleton from Dale Heights, you might be able to make a left hand turn at Spring Harbor Drive or go down to Whitney Way and get onto Old Middleton Road. Watch the signs.

Canstruction May 3

Canstruction is a community competition to end hunger. Teams build incredible, highly imaginative structures out of canned goods and packaged food they have either purchased or collected. After the competition, the food will be donated to MOM's Food Pantry. MOM will invite the public to view the structures and contribute their own donation of canned food to help end hunger. We need lots of volunteers to help execute this event. We will need volunteers especially the day before and after the event.

We currently have 24 teams for Canstruction and have raised over \$10,000 in financial sponsorship. Our celebrity guest judge will be AI Toon and Amy Carlson from NBC15 is our guest emcee. Please encourage all to attend. Details on the event can be found at <u>canstructionmadison.org</u>.


