May your Easter and Easter celebrations be both joyous and joyfilled as we again remember God's gift of new life through Jesus' resurrection.

Here at Dale Heights our Easter celebration begins at 8:30 a.m. with breakfast prepared by our Care & Fellowship Committee. It's followed at 10 a.m. by worship with communion in our spring flower -bedecked and fragranced sanctuary during which we hear again one of the Gospel accounts of grieving women disciples being the first to see and talk with the risen Jesus.

The Sforza Hours, a 15th-century image by Giovan Pietro Birago, shows Mary Magdalene ascending into heaven. Clad only in her own hair, illustrating her complete dependence upon God, she leaves behind scenes in which she preached the gospel message of hope. As she is borne aloft by four handsome angels, below her are the oceans, abysses, deserts and mountains where she witnessed to the sacred moment of her encounter with the risen Lord. In the foreground is a rocky path inviting you and me into the rugged landscape.

As we hear again the story of Mary Magdalene's tears-transformedinto-joy encounter with her risen Lord and how she ran to share the news with the other disciples, may our trust and hope in God's gift of new life for us send us running to tell others, through word or deed or both, as well.

Middleton Outreach Ministry Has A New Home

₩ MOM The Middleton Outreach Ministry Food Pantry moved to a larger location in order to better serve a growing number of clients and to make it easier for them to obtain needed services. The new location at 3502 Parmenter Street in Middleton is also home to the MOM office, which provides case management services as well as administrative support for the busy pantry and Clothing Center.

Prior to the move, the Food Pantry and Clothing Center operated at a warehouse space in the Middleton Business Park approximately 3 miles away from the office, which was located in downtown Middleton in a deteriorating, aging building. The new facility is also near a bus stop, which will provide greater ease of access for those who can currently only use the Food Pantry when they can find a ride.

The new office, Food Pantry, and Clothing Center opened on Monday, March 11, 2013. Volunteers will spent the weekend prior to the move restocking shelves and prepping the Pantry for customers.

"One of the first things that those living in poverty lose, in addition to maybe a home or a job, is dignity. For many, asking for help is something they never thought they would have to do. The shame and loss of pride in being self-sufficient is seen clearly on the faces of those who visit," said Al Ripp, Executive Director of MOM. "We want to restore that dignity and offer a trusting, understanding environment. While our new home is not elaborate or extravagant, we want to have a place where people can feel comfortable."

Middleton Outreach Ministry has seen an increase in use of services. MOM, which works to prevent homelessness and end hunger in the West Madison, Middleton and Cross Plains areas, is serving record numbers of people and regularly distributing over 60,000 pounds of food per month, with a total of over 750,000 pounds distributed in 2012. The pantry and mobile food pantries saw over 14,000 visits in 2012, an increase of nearly 20% over 2011 and a two year increase in visits of over 80%.

MOM received a \$20,000 grant from the Madison Community Foundation (MCF) to help purchase refrigerator units for the new facility that will allow MOM to accept large quantities of perishable food items that they have had to turn down in the past. They will also provide better preservation of donated items, as well as save energy and space.

"Being open six days per week, having adequate space was a real challenge for the type of traffic the MOM Food Pantry sees every day," said Cheri Farha, Distribution Center Manager. "To more effectively and efficiently serve those in need, this new Pantry will accommodate the growth we've seen and that which is sure to come."

A challenge to join Team MOMCanDo - comprised of MOM volunteers!!

Canstruction in a community competitive event to end hunger. MOM is already recruiting corporate, church, school and youth teams to make a structure completely out of food. MOM does that every day in the pantry, so they can do that too! MOM volunteers will build a structure in the shape of the MOM logo to be placed at the doorway to Canstruction. This will be a fun, active way to give to MOM and a great way to meet volunteers from other areas and shifts.

If you are interested in joining **Team MOMCanDo**, send your email address to noreen@momhelps.org. Noreen is also looking for someone to step forward to be cocaptains. The co-captains will keep contact with the team and to be in charge of what is needed for the build. The Team will also need the advice of someone with experience building structures, if you can recruit a builder, construction engineer or "handyperson" - wonderful! Donations to join the team will be used for the entry fees and for purchase of the canned goods. A suggested donation of \$20 to \$100 or more will get you a place on the team. All food and donations will go directly to the pantry!

Session Highlights

February 24, 2013

- During the Clerk of Session report, approved the January 20, 2013 stated Session meeting minutes, the February 13, 2013 called Session meeting minutes, and the January 27, 2013 annual Congregation/Corporation meeting minutes; and received the 2012 Statistical Report to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).
- During the Property & Finance Committee report, heard a brief report on the January and year-to-date financials; approved the final 2013 budget; and discussed the upcoming capital campaign for the parking lot and other potential projects, including a new sanctuary air conditioner, improvements to the sound system, and new flooring in the Lounge and the Concourse kitchenette.
- Received the monthly Pastor's report.
- During the continued Session reorganization conversation elected Harold Meyer as Treasurer for 2013, and elected Bill Mercer as Commissioner to Presbytery for 2013.
- Received highlights of the February 16, 2013 John Knox Presbytery meeting.
- During the Care & Fellowship Committee report learned that the Souper Bowl of Caring raised \$262.45 for the Middleton Outreach Ministry Food Pantry; and that the next meeting will be March 10 to plan the annual Easter Breakfast.
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report heard updates on the adult Church School and the Wednesday Lunch & Learn; discussed that there no longer is a functioning Christian Education Ministry Team and agreed that for now Session will do this as a committee of the whole; and decided not to have nor offer children's Church School this spring academic year while continuing to evaluate whether and how to offer it in the future.
- During the Nominating Committee report noted that Harold Meyer has agreed to serve as 2013 Church Treasurer.
- During the Outreach & Mission Committee report learned about upcoming potluck programs; about plans for promoting the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering; that we will be serving the Pres House supper April 7; that Ruby Meyer has stepped down and that Barb Fleishman is the new convener; and that the next meeting will be April 21.
- During the Personnel Committee report learned all employee and volunteer background checks are current; learned that due to the blizzard, flu and various deadlines that Maggie Rogers' and Rick Geiger's annual reviews are still to be scheduled; and learned that Edi Chan is coordinating volunteers to be with Maggie Rogers' children before and during Sunday worship.
- During the Transformation Coordinating Team report noted the next called Session meeting with the team March 20 to continue working on goals and other next steps following the Conference on the Future; noted the congregation-wide Bible study *Sign, Foretaste, Instrument* is underway and concludes March 13; and learned that from the Conference on the Future Tom Jones is reestablishing a church library in the Concourse and that Pastor Marilyn is working with Marcia Holman to recruit lay people to help lead the worship prayers.
- During the Worship & Music Committee report heard updates on the "Celebrate the Gifts of Women" service
 March 3 and plans for the Lent-Easter cultural emphasis on the British Isles; that the Maundy Thursday service will
 be incorporated into an evening potluck March 28; that Easter is March 31; and that the next meeting will be
 April 14.
- During Miscellaneous Business expressed thanks to Bill Holman for the business cards he designed for the church, and per his request discussed suggestions for improvement.
- The next stated Session meeting is Sunday, March 24, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. with Tom Jones leading devotions.

March 24, 2013

- During the Clerk of Session report, approved the February 24, 2013 stated Session meeting minutes.
- During the Property & Finance Committee report, heard a brief report on the February and year-to-date financials, noting that first quarter offering receipts are unusually down so far this year; heard progress updates on various projects; and approved a motion to launch a capital campaign to be led by Gerry Klump and to be conducted May 1-July 15, 2013.
- Received the monthly Pastor's report, which included that Ruling Elder member Cordelia "Dede" Mayberry died March 14, 2013 and that her memorial service will be April 27, 2013 at 1:00 p.m. at Dale Heights.
- During the Care & Fellowship Committee report heard plans for the annual Easter Breakfast, and approved their recommendation that the donations be designated for the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering.
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report heard updates on the adult Church School and the Wednesday Lunch & Learn.
- During the Nominating Committee report learned that Bill Mercer will be moving from the area in May, that his last Session meeting will be in April, and that the committee needs to begin seeking a nominee to be elected to fill his unexpired term.
- During the Outreach & Mission Committee report learned about an upcoming potluck program; and plans for serving the Pres House supper April 7.
- During the Personnel Committee report learned all employee and volunteer background checks are current; learned that Maggie Rogers' and Rick Geiger's annual reviews are still to be scheduled.
- During the Transformation Coordinating Team report continued discussion about the ideas generated during the March 20 meeting with Session and decided to let those prayerfully percolate for another month.
- During the Worship & Music Committee report were reminded that the Maundy Thursday service will be incorporated into an evening potluck March 28; that Easter is March 31; and that the next meeting is being rescheduled.
- During Miscellaneous Business selected a design from among the design options provided by Bill Holman for church business cards, and expressed thanks its thanks to Bill for his work on these.

Property & Finance Committee Highlights February 12, 2013

- Redecorating Task Force plans to paint fellowship stairwell on March 25 in advance of more "welcome" lettering to be done.
- Concrete Repair: will inquire about an estimate for redoing the church entrance concrete.
- Library bookcase: discussed attaching bookcase to the wall for safety reasons.
- Chair lift: quit working two weeks ago. Braun ThyssenKrupp did \$480 of repair work. To repair spring-loaded wiring spool, estimate is \$1420. Estimate received for \$8600 new from Braun. Internet search shows prices ranging from \$1780 to over \$2000. City of Madison permit costs range from \$480 to \$1010. Three options— to tear out, to repair, or to replace are referred to session.
- Discussed Peace Pole and Scouts line items under Local Outreach Funds. Referred to Outreach and session.
- Net budgeted income as if 2-28-13 is \$-5171. Offerings are low, even considering the "snow Sunday" when no collection was received.
- Next meeting: Tuesday, April 9, 7pm.
