Pastor Marilyn's Monthly Musings

As I'm writing this month's Musings I'm preparing to be on vacation and then to go to Louisville, KY to defend the Presbytery before the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission. Although I do not yet know whether the GAPJC will rule in the Presbytery's favor or order us to reexamine Scott Anderson for ordination under our recently approved new standards, I do know either way the Presbytery will be ordaining him later this year. Our case is scheduled to be heard by the GAPJC beginning at 8:30 a.m. EDT on Friday, July 29 in Louisville, Kentucky. Please keep all of the involved parties in your prayers during this difficult process.

While I voted in favor of ordaining Scott and have been defending the Presbytery's vote to do so the past two and a half years, I also recognize that in so doing there will be more division in our denomination, at least for awhile. Ordaining called, gifted gay and lesbian persons to church service has been a very intense, very bitter battle in our denomination for over 40 years. Being denied ordination has caused called, gifted persons much pain, and some have left and even rejected the church. Now as we prepare to ordain this new category of called, gifted persons, others who sincerely believe we are wrong to do so are in pain, and some will leave and even reject the church. I am keeping all persons on both sides of this bitter issue in my prayers, and I'm asking you to also be praying for them and for our denomination as we make this transition toward greater inclusivity.

Changing topics, I hope you were able to share in our church in the Concourse worship service July 17, but if you weren't, don't despair. I don't know when, but hopefully sometime this fall we will have another Sunday service in our beautiful Concourse.

You'll see elsewhere in this month's *Focus* that we will have a special "Children's Sunday" worship service on Sunday, August 14. As of this writing plans include special musical offerings by our own Abby Rogers, Sasha and Marco Jakovich, and loads of all around cuteness. Hope to see you there!

The suitcase held some souvenirs of our stops along the way. The conference on the past had many "snapshots" of our history, personal, church and global. The highlights shared at the conference on the past are posted on the board in the concourse for you to check out.

The input from the congregation at the conference on the past is helping us decide on how we proceed on the next part of our journey. A number of hypothesis will be presented in services and discussion groups in September and October. I thought I knew what "hypothesis" meant but checked it out on the internet. Session Meeting Highlights – July 19, 2011

- Approved the minutes of the May 24, 2011 stated Session meeting, the June 12, 2011 called Session meeting, the June 15, 2011 called Session meeting, and the June 26, 2011 called Congregational meeting
- During the Property & Finance Committee report received a brief report on the May and June monthly and year-to-date financials; heard a report on the 2012 University Avenue reconstruction project; heard an update on church security concerns; approved making the church a no firearms property unless affirmatively requested by Session or Pastor; and received an update on church redecorating plans
- > Received the monthly Pastor's report
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report learned that a fall planning meeting is set for August 7; that some of our young children will participate in the Sahlang Church's Vacation Bible School August 19-20; and that a new Lunch & Learn study will begin August 3
- > During the Personnel Committee report learned background checks for all employees are current, and are on-going for new volunteers
- During the Transformation Team report approved holding a "Conference on the Present" in place of worship Sunday, October 23 from 9:00-11:30 a.m.; heard about plans for "hypothesis" Sundays and adult studies during September and October; and that the next meeting will be August 10
- During the Outreach & Mission Committee report learned that some funds were used to help a neighborhood boy attend Scout camp this summer; heard a report on the mini-Bratfest fund-raiser July 17; learned the next Habitat for Humanity build is July 23; heard about plans to participate in Interfaith Day at Miller Park August 2; learned the next meeting will be August 7 and the next potluck program will be August 14; and approved providing supper for Pres House students October 23, 2011 and March 25, 2012
- During the Worship & Music Committee report learned a hymn by Ray Bayley and Tom Jones was debuted during worship July 10; heard a report on holding church in the Concourse July 17; that the guest preacher July 24 will be Sam Buffat and July 31 will be F. Gary Reynolds; heard a report that Maggie Rogers will be off and June Zeeh will play for worship July 31; heard about plans for periodic themed worship services throughout the year; learned there will be a "Children's Sunday" August 14 and another Hymn Festival September 4; and that the next meeting will be August 21
- > Set the next Session meeting for August 23, 2011 with Gerry Klump leading devotions

Worship and Music Committee Meeting Highlights June 26, 2011

- Learned that: July services will include an American Folk Hymn Sing, and a hymn written by Ray Bayley with music by Tom Jones.
- > June Žeeh will fill in for Maggie who will be on vacation on July 31.
- Sophie and Maggie are planning a children's music day on August 14.
- Maggie may be gone one Sunday in August, not sure of date yet.
- > Fall recital is still being considered for a Sunday evening or Sunday morning.
- > Discussed various seating configurations for "Worship in the Concourse" on July 17.
- > July 24th, Sam Buffat will be preaching while Marilyn is on vacation.
- September 4th: Hymn Festival
- Discussed worship options for September 11. Marilyn suggested that prayers be said for survivors and families of the deceased.
- October 2nd: We hope to have a joint service with Sah-Lang for World Communion Sunday.
- > October 23rd: Transformation Team "Conference on the Present" to be held downstairs.
- > October 30, November 6, and November 13 will be Stewardship Emphasis Sundays.
- > Learned that liturgists have been scheduled through July, and are needed for August.
- > Heard that the usher schedule for summer and fall has been put together.
- Next meeting date: August 21, 2011 with opening prayer by Marcia Holman.

Property & Finance Meeting Highlights – July 12, 2011

- Grounds: overgrown yews cut and removed except one near the sanctuary on the University Avenue side. Stumps to be removed later, as will the old sumacs. Ah-lang members help with larger tasks on 2nd Saturdays of the month.
- Redecorating task force focuses next on Sunday School Room 13. Painting help will be needed after mid-August.
- > Security camera still pending.
- > 2012 Reconstruction of University Avenue: City Engineering Devision letter received, detailing fees for concrete drive apron off Norman Way curb and gutter and 4' pavement, street lighting. Total \$12,458.72. No charge for sidewalk, which had been done a few years ago. Scott Appraisal is coming July 12 to look at the corner of the Dale Heights property to be affected by the reconstruction. Reimbursement for this loss may offset the charges above.
- Financial reports reviewed. Actual income is roughly even with year-to-date budgeted income, though furnace cost and higher gas and electric are reflected in the net budgeted income as showing -\$3744 as of 6/30/11.
- Because of passage of Concealed Carry law, committee is looking into what signs need to be posted.
- > Concourse thermostat not working well: the heating and cooling company will be called to try to get things cooled down before the worship in the concourse this Sunday.
- > Next meeting: Tuesday August 9, 2011 at 7 p.m.
