# Pastor Marilyn's Monthly Musings

Since Valentine's Day is this month I'm beginning my musings talking about facets of love. As recorded in the thirteenth chapter of John's Gospel during what we call his Maundy Thursday or Last Supper meal Jesus taught disciples how we are to love, saying, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

One of the ways Dale Heights will be expressing this kind of love this month is through our annual Souper Bowl of Caring following worship on Sunday, February 6. All proceeds will benefit Middleton Outreach Ministry's food pantry, which since last March has been allowing clients to shop for their food anytime rather than being restricted to once a month. I hope to see you there, showing your love to the hungry in MOM's service area through your generous financial contributions to our Souper Bowl meal together.

Another way Dale Heights expresses this kind of love is through educational and missional opportunities provided through our Outreach and Mission Committee. In addition to our monthly opportunities to help stock the MOM food pantry, upcoming plans for possible potluck programs and opportunities to share in hands-on mission include: Boy Scouts, Habitat for Humanity, Safe Families, Working Capital for Community Needs (formerly the Wisconsin Coordinating Council on Nicaragua), and a "green" shopping bags project. Please look for an announcement about which of these groups will be speaking to us in February.

Here at Dale Heights we have a commitment to having the doors open serving our neighbors seven days a week, not only for church events, but also as a kind of community center. Toward that goal, we are opening our doors to a public forum with the Dane County Executive candidates hosted by United for Funding February 10.

Since February is also Black History month and as a means of better loving and respecting our many different races and cultures, our Wednesday Lunch & Learn class is learning more about black/white race relations in this country by reading and discussing Timothy Tyson's Blood Done Sign My Name: A True Story.

And on February 27 we will especially show our love and thanksgiving to churchwomen through our Celebrate the Gifts of Women worship service.

The January issue of Dale Heights' *Focus* introduced the Missional Transformation Journey. At that time, members were being recruited to be part of the team. Below, the team members let you know when and why they joined Dale Heights and let you know why they are excited to be a member of the team.

#### Mike Holland:

After moving to the Whispering Hills
Townhouses just across University Avenue
from Dale Heights in 1998, my wife, kids and
I started walking to church for Sunday School
and worship. In 1999 we became members.
Those early family connections with the
church got me involved in Dale Heights
activities.

I am excited to participate in the Transformation team efforts because the program involves the congregation in simple and ongoing ways and because prayer and Bible study are included as part of the process for discerning how Dale Heights can continue fulfilling God's purpose in this new decade.

#### Roy Lembcke

I have been involved at Dale Heights since 1970. I came because Jim Sparks' first pastorate was my childhood church. Then, as now, members were asked to be on committees.

I welcomed the opportunity to help plan Dale Heights future, especially involvement with the congregation to find out their thoughts, goals and dreams about Dale Heights and its future.

I have been coming to Dale Heights for 11.5 years. Sam (my son) and I chose Dale

# Session Meeting Highlights - January 25, 2011

- > Examined new Elders
- > Elected Mike Holland 2011 Clerk of Session and Harold Meyer Treasurer
- > Elected Kim Chan and Bill Mercer to share serving as 2011 Commissioner to Presbytery meetings
- > Signed up for 2011 Committees and Ministry Teams
- > Approved the December 16, 2010 Session meeting minutes
- During the Property and Finance Committee report, received a brief report on the December monthly and year-end financials; approved a balanced 2011 budget of \$145,757; and received information about an upcoming public forum with Dane County Executive candidates at Dale Heights
- Received the monthly Pastor's report, which included a review of how the Sah-lang church came to be nesting at Dale Heights; and that Dale Heights will be featured on the John Knox Presbytery page in the 2012 Mission Yearbook
- > Learned that the Committee on Ministry approved the covenant agreement with Parish Associate for Outreach and Mission Dietrich Gruen, that he has begun his work with the Outreach and Mission Committee, and that he is working on distributing fliers promoting Dale Heights as the Middleton Presbyterian Church
- > During the Christian Education Ministry Team report, heard reports on the Church School classes; and heard an update on the Lunch & Learn study
- > During the Personnel Committee report, learned that background checks for all employees and volunteers are current
- > During the Transformation Coordinating Team report heard about the first Presbytery training event; that the team is currently meeting weekly; and that the team will need to meet with Session sometime before the May Presbytery training event
- > During the Outreach and Mission Committee report, learned about upcoming informational potluck plans, including programs by Boy Scouts, Habitat for Humanity, and Safe Families
- > Approved dissolving the Inviting and Welcoming Ministry Team, returning its functions to the Care and Fellowship, and Outreach and Mission committees
- > During the Worship and Music Committee report, learned that the next meeting is rescheduled for January 30, 2011
- > During the Care & Fellowship Committee report approved a request to move Anum Akai to the Inactive Roll
- > During the Nominating Committee report decided to postpone church officer training plans till later this year after discussion about how the transformation process might refocus what kind of officer training is needed
- > The next meeting will be February 17, 2011 with Bill Mercer leading devotions.

# Property & Finance Committee Meeting Highlights – January 11, 2011

- > Learned that Quickbooks is now up and running so that Gerry Klump can conduct our annual audit
- > Discussed recent break-ins to the white garage and plans to install a padlock on the door
- > Recommended a balanced 2011 church budget of \$145,757 to Session for approval.
- > Financial reports received. As of December 31, 2010, year-to-date actual income was \$6,266 compared to budgeted net income of \$0, with most of that due to not having as high of snow removal costs as budgeted.
- Next meeting will be Tuesday February 8 at 7:00 pm.
