Pastor Marilyn's Monthly Musings

As I write this month's "musings" the 219th General Assembly is much on my mind. Since the Moderator/Vice Moderator orientation in early June, I've been studying up on the business to come before the Assembly, have been reading materials about some of that business sent to me by groups encouraging me to support some items and not to support others, and I have been writing speeches. As you know, I am standing for Vice Moderator of the Assembly with Moderator candidate Rev. Eric Nielsen. Eric has honored me by asking me to deliver his nominating speech before the Assembly as part of the election process on July 3. If Eric is elected, I will then make a speech as part of my own confirmation process on July 7. During the days between Moderator's election and the Vice Moderator's confirmation, we will be in worship and committee meetings in preparation for the "meat" of the Assembly business July 7-10. Please keep me and all the General Assembly commissioners in your prayers as we seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in our decisions July 3-10.

During a recent Session meeting, we had talked about my making a live report via Skype to Dale Heights during the fellowship time on Sunday, July 4. However, because the General Assembly worship is from 10-12 Noon that morning, I will not be able to report to you live. Instead, after the Moderator election on Saturday night, I will record and e-mail a video report to Session members, who will share it with my Dale Heights church family during the fellowship time on Sunday, July 4. Lest you think the General Assembly is the only thing happening in July, I'm going to now shift gears and share about some other activities to look forward to enjoying together. Sunday, July 4 Maggie Rogers has put together our annual American Folk Music Sunday, and you will welcome guest preacher Rev. Scott Marrese-Wheeler to the pulpit. If you were disappointed not to hear one of your favorite hymns during the June 13 annual Hymn Festival, you'll have another chance July 11. The second tier of favorites you voted for back in May will make up another Hymn Festival service that day, along with some anticipated special music offerings by some of our Dale Heights family. And I'm aware of a special music treat in store for you during morning worship Sunday, July 18 as well. In the busyness and restfulness of summer, I hope you'll make time for these this month along with simply sharing worship and fellowship together with our Dale Heights family.

Property & Finance Meeting Highlights – June 8, 2010

- > Storm water management project is scheduled for the last week in June with the tile replacement occurring sometime after that.
- Missing Memorial Garden plaques will be inventoried and replacements ordered.
- Redecorating task force painting project will begin June 26.
- Discussion held regarding mount for camera/sound system enabling audio (concourse) and audio/visual (nursery) transmission of sanctuary services.
- Request made for session approval to spend up to \$3,000 to replace our riding lawn mower. Will seek price break and trade-in of the old mower which blew a gasket.
- Regarding can light replacement in concourse: a voltage check, changing timer hours and investigating installing transformers will be done in effort to lower electric usage and extend life of bulbs.
- > H/AC: report of new concourse thermostat. Recirculating pump will be purchased for \$150 and installed by member of Finance & Property.
- Decided to maintain parking lot again next summer and wait a year or two before resealing.
- This month income and expenses for the year are roughly even. Gas/electric bill came in \$1650 under budget and snowplowing was \$2440 under budget. Thanks to all for keeping your pledges current! Year-to-date net loss through May 2010 is \$280 versus a projected net loss of \$6,183.
- > The next meeting will be Tuesday, July 13, 2010 at 7:00 p.m.

Update on The Road Home's Housing & Hope Campaign

Did you know? Housing & Hope - Phase I is complete! The Housing and Hope apartments are an innovative strategy that will create 30 units of permanent, affordable, supported housing for homeless families when complete. Currently, nineteen adults and forty-two children are in residence at the first fifteen apartments, helped by an on-site case manager with an office in one of the buildings.

"This program has honestly saved our lives," says one resident mom with two preschool age children. "If we weren't in Housing and Hope I'm almost positive we would be homeless again, but we've been in housing 7 months now because of the affordable rent and the support of our case manager. And we're all paid up on rent!"

General Statement of Duties:

Manage, coordinate, steward, and develop program operations for seniors in the MOM service area.

Position Description

The primary responsibility of the Senior Program Manager at Middleton Outreach Ministry (MOM) is to further the mission of the Senior Program (formerly the POP Program) by coordinating opportunities for the seniors in the MOM service area. The program strives to help seniors remain independent in their homes for as long as they are physically and mentally able, through the effective utilization of volunteers.

To perform these duties requires a high degree of independent judgment and discretion, knowledge of organization and policy; and an understanding of programs, procedures and regulations in order to determine priorities. Position holder must have versatility due to the nature and frequency of program activities. Position holder must also exercise elevated level of integrity and assessment ability due to the high degree of exposure to sensitive and confidential information.

Desired Knowledge, skills, abilities, and experience:

- · Highly organized and ability to multi-task
- · Attention to detail and effective oral and written communication skills
- Ability to work independently
- Experience working with volunteers and groups
- Ability to provide leadership and guide activities of individuals and groups
- Ability to communicate clearly and to establish and maintain effective working relationships within the agency and with other agencies and community groups
- · Strong assessment ability and clarity of boundaries
- Maintain confidentiality
- Passionate about the mission of the organization and the senior community
- · Experience with Windows, Word and Excel

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Manage program activities with goals set for Senior Program including transportation services, shopping assistance and group indoor and outdoor chores
- Track information needed in accordance with set indicators and measurement tools by maintaining accurate records of service provided for reporting quarterly and annually for monthly metrics and quarterly reports
- · Maintain concise information on clients and volunteers in database
- Regularly assess client status by using defined parameters for match with program services
- · Coordinate service opportunities and activities
- Apply best practices and procedures in communicating with and coordinating volunteers
- Refer volunteer mismatches, chronic no-shows, and problematic situations to Director of Volunteer Services
- Plan on-going training and evaluation of volunteers' proper placement, optimal performance, and long-term retention throughout the year. Show recognition and appreciation for volunteers
- Sustain and build lasting external relations to advance the mission of the Senior Program & MOM
- Write and distribute a volunteer monthly newsletter
