## Pastor Marilyn's Monthly Musings

We have some exciting things planned this month that you won't want to miss!

Sunday, July 3 will be our annual American Folk Music worship service for which Maggie selects hymns and other worship music from the range of American folk music for our worship enjoyment. I hated having to miss last year's American Folk Music Sunday while I was a commissioner to the 219<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, so am especially looking forward to being back for it this year.

On Sunday, July 10 we will debut a new hymn, with lyrics written by our very own Ray Bayley and music composed by our very own Tom Jones. We all know what a great poet and wordsmith Ray is, so this will be a real treat!

Then on Sunday, July 17 we will be worshiping in the Concourse. The idea to do so came after the power went out during choir rehearsal. Maggie and the choir moved to the Concourse because with all its windows it provided the best natural light. She shared with me how great the acoustics were and that it would be cool for the choir to sing in the Concourse sometime. I said why not have a whole service in the Concourse, asked the Session, and they said yes. So come, come, come, come to "Church in the Concourse" Sunday, July 17!

You'll see elsewhere in this month's *Focus* that I will be off the last two Sundays of the month, one for vacation and one as Chair of the Presbytery's Committee of Counsel defending it in a remedial case that has been appealed to the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission. The case was brought against the Presbytery for our decision to ordain Scott Anderson, an openly gay and partnered Candidate under care of the Presbytery. Last October the Synod Permanent Judicial Commission ruled in the Presbytery's favor, but those who brought the case had the right and did appeal the ruling to the GAPJC. However the GAPJC rules, this will end this case against the Presbytery. Our case is scheduled to be heard by the GAPJC beginning at 8:30 a.m. EDT on Friday, July 29 in Louisville, Kentucky. Please keep all of the involved parties in your prayers during this difficult process.

### **Transformation Team Report**

There is not a lot to report from your transformational team this month. After "traveling" quite a bit in the first half of the year, we are taking a little break from the activities.

That does not mean that nothing is going on. Coach Clara met with the Session and led another part of the process titled "Discovering How Our Church Organization Works."

The team has another meeting late in June to start planning our itinerary in the fall. Stay tuned. You never know where the suitcase will show up.

But until then, enjoy the more relaxed pace of summer.

### **Outreach Potluck Featuring Porchlight**

On June 5<sup>th</sup> executive director of Porchlight, Steven Schooler, gave a presentation at an Outreach sponsored potluck. Porchlight provides emergency shelter, food, employment services, counseling, and affordable transitional and permanent housing to homeless people in the Dane County area. Porchlight's services are designed to foster independence and the transition into permanent housing and employment. Porchlight is the largest supplier of low-cost housing in Dane County and is comprised of an emergency shelter for men, housing and services for men and women suffering from serious mental illnesses, 172 single room or efficiency units and 55 family units. Every year Porchlight provides over 350 women, men and children with over 100,000 nights of shelters.

Steve's excellent presentation was filled with detailed information about the causes of homeless in Madison and the users of Porchlight's services. His presentation focused primarily on mental illness and homelessness. Fifty seven percent of currently homeless people had some type of mental health problem in their lifetime and forty seven percent report a mental health problem in combination with alcohol and drug addiction problem. In addition he presented information on why housing is not affordable in Dane county. A person earning \$9.62/hour has approximately \$500 available per month for an apartment yet even a studio apartment rents for \$574.00.

Steve presented a study that used neuroimaging of peoples' brains and their reactions to selected people. The results were very sobering. The research found that homeless people elicited brain reactions consistent with disgust and fear and that they are perceived as less than human provoking the same reaction in the brain as disgusting objects.

Porchlight is providing solutions to the struggle these people are facing by providing low cost housing. They also provide supportive services for the mentally ill. The organization is reaching the end of a campaign to raise \$3.5 million dollars to build a facility that will replace and expand their current facility that provides housing and support service for homeless men and women with mental illness.

We are very grateful for the wonderful work that Steven Schooler and the staff at Porchlight do for our community. The Outreach committee is also grateful for the continued support of the potlucks by the Dale Heights family.

## Called Session Meeting Highlights - June 15, 2011


- > Met with Transformation Coach Clara Thompson for our "Discovering How Our Church Organization Works" exercise.
- Also in May Session met electronically to approve holding worship in the Concourse Sunday, July 17; and also met electronically in June to approve a request from Roy Lembcke to solicit funds from church members to help Anum Akai travel home to Ghana to visit family.

## Property & Finance Meeting Highlights – June 14, 2011

- > Met with Eli Kelling regarding security cameras. He will be asked to start the security process by putting a camera inside the office entrance to the church.
- > Removal of two yews completed. No outside interest in taking the arborvitae, so they will be cut.
- > Memorial gardens: in addition to extra markers, extra marker stands will be ordered to replace missing ones.
- > Sound system: continued difficulty with sanctuary microphones—recalled that WORT sound engineer has advised replacement of both. No decision made.
- Work days: every Saturday this summer, but effort will be made to coordinate several work days with Sah-Lang. Special emphases: basement folding chair clean-up and yard tree removal. Spalling brick on two church chimneys: sealant will be purchased and Maintenance asked to apply.
- > Referred to Outreach: information on peace pole signage and Little Library program.
- > Financial reports reviewed. Memorial Fund donor will be asked about ideas for use. General: Year-to-date Net Income is \$-5,850 versus budgeted net income of 0. Furnace costs make up quite a bit of this difference.
- > Next meeting: Tuesday July 12 at 7 p.m.

# Outreach & Mission Committee Meeting Highlights – June 12, 2011

- -The 2011 Bread for the World offering of letters campaign was discussed. This years' campaign urges Congress and the administration to press forward with reforms to make U.S. foreign assistance more effective in reducing poverty. These reforms will help millions of people move out of hunger and poverty. The committee plans to offer this information to the congregation and organize a letter writing after worship.
- -Wisconsin Network for Peace and Justice (WNPJ) is one of the state organizations that our church supports through Outreach funds. WNPJ is asking for signatures on an open letter to government officials stating opposition to the use of drones by the military. A drone is a small unmanned airplane-type vehicle that is flown by remote control. "Shadow drones" carry cameras and are used for surveillance. "Predator drones" carry bombs that are currently being dropped on the people of Afghanistan and Pakistan by the U.S. government. Wisconsin has plans to build an \$8.2 million drone training facility at Camp Williams to be used for military personnel learning to control drones. About 95% of the money will come from the federal government, with the rest coming from our state. The letter and more information are available on the outreach table.
- -The committee approved funds be given to a local Cub Scout pack as a scholarship for a scout to attend summer camp. The cost of the camp is \$125.00. A gift is being made in the honor of Bob Jorgenson by his family for Father's Day in support of this scholarship along with Outreach funds,
- -A potluck is scheduled for July 24<sup>th</sup> with a speaker from ARC Community Services. We will be asking those attending to bring their own table service (plates, silverware, cup).
- -We plan to see if any members are interested in attending Interfaith Day at Miller Park, for 7pm game on Aug 2. The Brewers will be playing the St. Louis Cardinals. The purpose of the event is to create public-awareness for the Interfaith Conference of Greater Milwaukee. The Interfaith Conference of Greater Milwaukee is the interfaith agency established by the religious community to address the social issues affecting the quality of life in the Greater Milwaukee area. Tickets are \$10 and an Interfaith Conference of Greater Milwaukee t-shirt is available for \$5. Everyone going from Dale Heights would be able to sit together. Deadline for tickets and shirts is July 1<sup>st</sup>. Gale will collect names and money.
