# Pastor Marilyn's Monthly Musings

As I write this month's "musings" I'm getting ready to head to Louisville, Kentucky next week for the General Assembly Moderator/Vice Moderator orientation. Although it's been a month since Eric Nielsen called to tell me he's standing for Moderator and invited me to stand with him for Vice Moderator of the 219<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, I don't think it's all guite completely sunk in. So I'm expecting/hoping to have a better handle on what I may be getting myself into after next week. Currently there are six Moderator candidates. The pair elected will begin serving immediately, moderating the General Assembly meeting in the Twin Cities this July. The two will then serve as goodwill ambassadors for the Presbyterian Church (USA) for the next two years, traveling around the country, as well as making a couple of international trips. In addition to that bit of excitement in my life, our church has what I think is an exciting month ahead of us. We will mourn the death and celebrate the life of former pastor Tom Dietrich in a committal of his ashes service in the Dale Heights Memorial Gardens on June 5. His family has prepared a nice announcement of the service, which you can read elsewhere in this month's Focus. We will have another joint worship service with our Sah-lang Korean Church sisters and brothers on June 6, followed by a shared church picnic on the front lawn. Please note that worship will be at 11:00 a.m. that morning.

On either June 12 or 26, or both, we will begin our joint church redecorating project by painting two areas of the church. On June 13<sup>th</sup> we will have our 6<sup>th</sup> annual Hymn Festival for morning worship, during which and the fellowship time we will honor our 2010 graduates from pre-school, high school, college, and graduate school.

June 20<sup>th</sup> we will welcome back our own international musicians Todd and Amy Schendel, along with their friend Gabriel Bita for a concert fund-raiser with proceeds shared equally between their Contrapunctus Brass Trio and Middleton Outreach Ministry. You can read more about their plans elsewhere in this month's Focus.

Then on June 27<sup>th</sup> we will welcome the Rev. Gary Catterson as our speaker for an Outreach potluck. In addition to pasturing the Presbyterian Church in Postville, IA, Gary serves on the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance national response team. He will be sharing with us about PDA. You can read more about Gary and some of what he may talk to us about elsewhere in this month's Focus. There are also PDA posters and other materials available for your perusal on the Outreach table in the Concourse.

### Outreach Potluck on June 27th

There will be an Outreach potluck following worship on Sunday, July 27<sup>th</sup>. Our speaker is Rev. Gary Catterson. who has been pastor of Community Presbyterian Church in Postville, Iowa for 15 years. He also serves on the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) National Response Team.

PDA National Response Team members are the first PDA representatives in the field following a national disaster. They provide support to presbyteries and synods as they assess the impact of the disaster on both the church and the community, and they assist in connecting presbyteries to recovery resources. Rev. Catterson is currently part of the "Care Team." The Care Team is in contact with those on deployment and are in prayer for them during that time. He has led two trips to the Gulf for John Knox Presbytery.

Recall that one third of the One Great Hour of Sharing special offering goes to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. The prevalence of natural disasters in our country and around the world in recent time has been met with response by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. Rev. Catterson will share his experiences and provide general information about this program that enables our congregation to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crisis and catastrophic events.

The Contrapunctus Brass Trio will present concerts at Dale Heights Presbyterian Church on June  $20^{th}$ , 7 p.m. and at Bethel Lutheran Church, June  $22^{nd}$ , 7 p.m.

These concerts are in conjunction with a CD release of *Full Power* featuring Amy and Todd Schendel, members of the Contrapunctus Brass Trio. The Madison concerts coincide with performances in Texas, Iowa, Wisconsin, and with international concerts in Augsburg, Dachau (Germany), Lausanne (Switzerland), and Aarhus (Denmark).

The Dale Heights program consists of arias, concerti, and popular works of the Baroque and Romantic era from Handel's *Messiah*, Bach's *Christmas Oratorio*, *Bist du bei mir*, *Air on a G string*, and Balakirev's piano composition "Islamey", Fantaisie orientale. A freewill offering will be taken with 50% of the proceeds donated to the Middleton Outreach Ministry (MOM).

The Bethel program features various selections of American music. Examples include *Abe Lincoln's Song Book: Trio Arrangements with Narration,* commissioned and recorded by the Contrapunctus Brass Trio. *Abe Lincoln's Song Book,* composed and arranged by Douglas Hill, is comprised of music Lincoln discussed in letters and enjoyed. Other works include selections like *76 Trombones* from "The Music Man", Fillmore's *Rolling Thunder,* John Stevens' *Autumn* from "Seasons", Eric Ewazen's *Elizabethan Songbook,* and Liszt's piano virtuoso composition *Rhapsodie espagnole.*

## Dale Heights Charter Member Dies



**BOOTS HEEBINK**, died April 20, 2010 in Seattle, Washington. She was born in Denmark, Wisconsin in 1915 to Edward and Emma Hartwig, and named Beulah, but was known all of her life as Boots. She grew up in Manitowoc, Wisconsin and attended the University of Wisconsin, where she met and married Thomas B. Heebink in 1938. After 27 years raising a family in Madison, Wisconsin, Tom and Boots moved to Seattle in 1965. She was preceded in death by her husband, Tom, in 1990 (her one and only bridge partner) and her grandson, Peter Kienast, in 2008.

She is survived by her children Tom Heebink (Marilyn) of Belle Mead, NJ, Sue Kienast (Phil) of Bothell, WA and Peter Heebink of Whitehorse, Yukon Territory, Canada and her grandchildren: Todd Heebink, Paige Torgerson, Kurt Kienast, Kevin Kienast, Erika Lipkin, Bret Heebink, and Britni Bakk. She had 11 great-grandchildren (Andrew, Kendall, Kate, Ben, Madilyn, Devon, Sydney, Charlotte, Brett, Heidi and Mya) and many nieces and nephews.

Boots was a stay-at-home mom, but did volunteer work at Dale Heights Presbyterian Church and Madison General Hospital in Wisconsin and part-time and volunteer work at Wedgewood Presbyterian Church, Northwest Hospital and the Bothell Museum in Washington. She enjoyed gardening, going to her kids and grandkids games, traveling to Europe and Hawaii (18 times, she kept saying).

A staunch Democrat until the end, Boots did not mind telling you what she thought of the "other" party. She enjoyed needle pointing, reading history books, watching golf on T.V. (especially her favorite player, Fred Couples) and collecting pictures of all of her grand and great-grand children.

At her request, there will be no official service, but a family memorial celebration of her life will be held this summer in Wisconsin. Donations may be made to the Bothell Historical Museum, PO 313, Bothell, WA 98041 or a charity of your choosing.

- > Approved the April 21, 2010 Session meeting minutes
- Received official confirmation that the second Concourse loan has been repaid in full
- During the Property and Finance Committee report, received a brief report on the April monthly and year-to-date financials, which showed a net loss of over \$450, and a year-to-date net loss of just over \$3,100; approved a bid and contingency expenses up to \$6,000 to deal with the church basement storm water management, to be paid from a recent unrestricted \$25,000 memorial gift; learned church work days have been set for the second Saturday of the month through the summer; and received a report from the joint Dale Heights-Sah-lang painting and redecorating task force that it is ready to begin the first two projects in June
- Received the monthly Pastor's report, including a new website update report; and received information that it's time for our Committee on Ministry triennial visit, which will be scheduled sometime this fall
- Met with Executive Presbyter Ken Meunier about ways the Presbytery will be helpful to Dale Heights if Pastor Marilyn is elected Vice Moderator of the 219<sup>th</sup> General Assembly; and heard more about the Presbytery's Missional Church plans
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report, heard reports on plans for some summer children's Church School activities; and heard an update on the Lunch & Learn study
- During the Personnel Committee report, received a report from the May 6 meeting, including a recommendation not to re-establish the Nursery Attendant position at this time and alternative volunteer suggestions; and learned that background checks for all employees are current
- > There was no Inviting and Welcoming Ministry Team report
- > Received a report on the May 18 John Knox Presbytery meeting
- During the Outreach and Mission Committee report, heard a report Dane Count United house meetings are still to be scheduled; that the Rev. Gary Catterson, pastor of Community Presbyterian Church in Postville, IA and a member of the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance National Response Team will present a program during a potluck June 27; and received information about an opportunity to join with Lutheran Social Services in helping resettle Bhutanese refugee families coming to the Madison area
- During the Worship and Music Committee report, heard a report on doing communion a new way; that the Pentecost service was outdoors and the sound system was borrowed from the Sah-lang Church; that there will be a joint worship service with Sah-lang at 11:00 a.m. June 6 followed by a shared church picnic; approved a recommendation not to have communion June 6; and that the next cultural emphasis will be Swiss/German/Netherlands for Advent/Christmas
- During the Care and Fellowship Committee report learned a Graduates' Reception is planned for June 13
- > The next meeting will be July 28, 2010 with Gerry Klump leading devotions.

## Worship & Music Meeting Highlights April 25, 2010

- Maggie Rogers reported that she will be off June 6, July 18, & August 15. May 30 will be the choir's last Sunday until fall. The Hymn Festival is scheduled for June 13 and American Folk Hymns on July 4. Other themed hymn Sundays TBD. Summer special music sign-ups have started; no special music scheduled yet for June 6.
- Pastor Marilyn reported: the Pentecost, Sunday, May 23 will be an outdoor service with seating available on cement for those needing a stable walking area. Sunday June 6 a possible spring/summer joint worship with Sah-lang and a picnic. The Schendels have planned a concert

for the evening of June 20and possibly special music for the morning service .

- Decided to continue with the holiday seasons of Advent/Christmas & Lent/Easter to celebrate & learn from cultures represented in our Dale Heights family. Advent/Christmas this year will celebrate the Swiss, German & perhaps the Netherlands cultures.
- Reviewed the Ash Wednesday & Maundy Thursday services. Dwindling attendance at Ash Wednesday service suggests considering a joint service with other churches. The joint Maundy Thursday service at Covenant was well attended by Dale Heights. Dale Heights will participate in the next Good Friday joint service held every 2 years.
- > Decided to order carnations for Father's Day, June 20.
- > Worship Committee members will host Coffee Hour in May.
- > Pulpit Supply scheduled for all but July 11.
- > Liturgists scheduled through June.
- Communion: the format at the Covenant Maundy Thursday service will be used on May 2 & perhaps at future services.
- Keith Chan has agreed to head the Usher Committee. Discussed suggestions to improve participation.
- Goals for 2010: Kim plans to have children sing during the fall services with help from the older youth.
- > The next meeting will be at 11:30 a.m. in August—date TBD.

# John Knox Presbytery Meeting Highlights

Here are some highlights from the May 18 John Knox Presbytery Meeting:

- Shared worship with an Evangelism theme led by the Rev. Mark Elsdon, Campus Co-Pastor of Pres House.
- Received the Committee on Preparation for Ministry report, during which examined and approved for ordination Candidate Kelly Gregory, who has a call as Chaplain of Banner Good Samaritan Hospital in
- Received the Committee on Ministry report, during which approved granting the status of Honorably Retired to the Rev. Daniel J. Adams and the Rev. Carole Chou Adams effective June 30, 2010; that the Stated Clerk request Winnebago Presbytery dismiss the Rev. Thomas L. Williams and enrolling him as an active member of John Knox upon receipt of his credentials; the Administrative Commission for ordaining Kelly Gregory May 30, 2010 at 3:00 p.m. at First Presbyterian Church, Dubuque, IA; examined and approved Candidate Kathleen Cook Owens for ordination, and approved the Administrative Commission for ordaining her May 23, 2010 at 4:00 p.m. at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Madison, WI.
- Enjoyed a power-point presentation of Pres House updates by Campus Co-Pastor Mark Elsdon, including news that average worship presentation had increased from 0 to 44 in the past 5 years, that largely through the efforts of a now former Board member a Wisconsin state law was changed so that the new Pres House residence hall has tax-exempt status, that a new pipe and digital organ is being installed with a dedication planned for October 10, 2010, that there is now a choir, and that there are now student Board and other leaders.
- During the Announcements heard about the next Presbytery Day event planned for September 25, 2010 at Sugar Creek Bible Camp, with more details to follow.
- Commissioned Elders Jeanne Evert and Derek Pursey, the Revs. Marilyn Gamm and Clara Thompson, YAD Ndaziona Ndafooka-Holland, and alternates Elder Dennis Thurow and the Rev. David King as commissioners to the upcoming 219<sup>th</sup> General Assembly meeting.
- During Equipping the Saints received and discussed A Proposal for Consultation with the Center for Parish Development. Plans are to bring this or another proposal to the August presbytery meeting for approval.
- Received the Presbytery Council report, during which approved adopting the 2009 audit report, and approved the following Personnel Committee recommendations: changing the Stated Clerk's term length back to three years from two years in the Manual of Operations, approved the first reading of four changes to the John Knox Presbytery By-Laws, and announced opening the search for Stated Clerk, with applications to be included in the August presbytery information. (Stated Clerk Alyson Janke's current term expires at the end of 2010).
- Received and approved for adoption and forwarding to the Synod of Lakes and Prairies the annual Committee on Representation report.
- Received the Moderator, Executive Presbyter, Treasurer, and Stated Clerk's reports; and during the Stated Clerk's Report approved the first reading of five By-Laws revisions; heard a thank you letter from the General Assembly Stated Clerk for John Knox having remitted its full per capita; learned that a new remedial case alleging irregularities in the presbytery's February 20 vote to ordain Scott Anderson has been filed against the presbytery, that the Synod Permanent Judicial Commission has scheduled a trial for the case October 9, 2010, that the John Knox Moderator appointed the Revs. Shirley Funk, Marilyn Gamm and Mike Hibbs as Committee of Counsel representing the presbytery, that the Synod PJC has granted a stay of enforcement preventing the presbytery from ordaining Scott Anderson pending the outcome of the case, and that the Central Florida, Prospect Hill and Stockton presbyteries have petitioned to join the case against John Knox.
- Approved endorsing the candidacies of the Rev. Eric Nielsen, Northern Waters Presbytery, for Moderator of the 219<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, and the Rev. Marilyn Gamm for Vice Moderator.
- > The next meeting will be August 21, 2010 at First Presbyterian Church, Lodi, WI.
