It is Lent and this year's cultural emphasis is Korea. Three Sundays during Lent, maybe all in March or maybe one in April, some of our Sah-lang Church Korean sisters and brothers will be sharing with us about their homeland. Since this is the fifth anniversary year of when the Sah-lang Church began nesting with us, it seems especially appropriate to have this opportunity to know more about the culture and traditions of our Korean brothers and sisters. And as an early heads up, we will celebrate the 5^{th} anniversary of Sah-lang coming to Dale Heights in a special joint service celebrating our church's 55^{th} anniversary on Sunday, April 29 at 11:00 a.m.

On Sunday, March 4 we will again observe "Celebrate the Gifts of Women" during morning worship. We will also dedicate our new Vision Panel as part of our transformation journey that morning.

I'd like to especially invite you to join us when and as you are able in our Lunch & Learn class Lenten Bible study about "gates" throughout the Bible as metaphors for God's gracious activities, which continues this month, and you can read about elsewhere in this month's Focus.

It occurs to me that someone has a great sense of humor for the blarney fun and foolishness of St. Patrick's Day to occur annually during the somber, meditative Lenten season. As someone with a wee drop of Irish, I actually appreciate this irony. Happy St. Patrick's Day on March 17!

This month on March 26 the long-awaited/dreaded University Avenue reconstruction project begins in front of Dale Heights. Please be patient and continue your active participation in Dale Heights activities during this road project, and please continue to invite and encourage others to come experience our Dale Heights church family as well.

Celebrate the Gifts of Women Sunday March 4, 2012

Honoring Stories of Courage, Struggle and Survival

On Celebrate the Gifts of Women Sunday, March 4, 2012, we honor women who contribute their gifts to the church and community, lift up issues of women's rights, and focus on the role of women in our communities and world.

On March 4, 2012, the second Sunday of Lent, assigned lectionary texts direct us to God's covenant with Abraham (Gen. 17) and his exemplary faith (Rom. 4). On this Celebrate the Gifts of Women Sunday, we do well to consider also the story that slips through the cracks: that of Hagar, the other woman in Abraham's life. Her full story is not featured in the lectionary, perhaps because the abuse she suffers at the hands of Sarah and Abraham does not reflect well on our foremother and forefather

in faith. It is fitting to consider Hagar's story during Lent, a season of repentance. Remembering this story also provides an occasion to honor Hagar's courage and struggle to survive, to carve out a future for herself and her child with the help of God. Her commitment to survival and flourishing, amid the challenges that beset her, mirrors that of many women around the world to this day, and such commitment is to be celebrated.

Property & Finance Meeting Highlights – February 14, 2012

- New lavaliere microphone part purchased.
- Roof heat tape installed; one hookup remains to be done.
- > Revised 2012 Draft Budget being sent to Session for approval.
- > Faucet repair in kitchen is done.
- > Difficulty with locks. Will ask Bill's Locksmith to replace the office entry door and office door locks or lock cylinders (using the same keying system).
- > Discussions on use of various Memorial funds and on a "Second Miler" proposal.
- Interior can light special bulb replacement needed.
- > January pension bill now shows \$1,600 credit. This corrects previous overcharge.
- Financial status reports reviewed. Financial status as of 1/31/2012 (year-to-date) is -\$5,592 compared to budgeted net income. Primarily due to one-time payments in January. Also, January offerings were slightly down.

- During the Clerk's report, approved the minutes of the called January 22, 2012 Session meeting, the January 25, 2012 stated Session meeting, and the January 29, 2012 Annual Congregation/Corporation meeting
- During the Property & Finance Committee report received a brief report on the January monthly and year-to-date financials; approved a revised, 2012 budget projecting income of \$147,484, expenses of \$147,484, with a projected surplus of \$2,914; heard an update on replacing the sanctuary sound system; learned the University Avenue reconstruction project will begin March 26, 2012; received an update on church redecorating plans; tabled inaugurating any kind of a "Second Mile" offering proposal for a possible future time; reviewed and adjusted where the church plans to advertise this year; approved allowing Rick Geiger, Vreni Straubhaar and Sandy Weigt to tackle cleaning out the church attic; and approved giving the old gold choir robes to St. Vincent de Paul
- Received the monthly Pastor's report, including that she has been elected to a four-year unexpired term on the General Assembly Mission Council Class of 2016; approved her 2012 Vacation and Study Leave dates; and reported the death of member Betty Lewis on January 26, 2012
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report heard updates on the weekly children's church school and on the Wednesday Lunch & Learn class
- > During the Personnel Committee report learned that all employee and volunteer background checks are current
- Received the February 18, 2012 John Knox Presbytery report
- > During the Transformation Team report learned that the next meeting will be February 23, 2012, approved dedicating the Vision Panel during worship March 4, 2012; and that the team and Vision Panel will be trained by Coach Clara Thompson March 7, 2012
- During the Outreach & Mission Committee report learned a Voter Registration Information and Drive has been being held in the Concourse; discussed ideas for a summer pig roast and a Thanksgiving dinner for the neighborhood; was reminded that the next Pres House Supper will be March 25, 2012; and learned there will be a potluck program on dyslexia May 6, 2012
- During the Worship & Music Committee report heard a report on the Ash Wednesday worship in conjunction with the noon Wednesday Lunch & learn class on February 22, 2012; heard an update on plans for the Korean Lent-Easter cultural emphasis, and the joint 55th and 5th anniversary celebration service with the Sah-lang Church on April 29, 2012, with former pastors and members to be invited
- > Set the next Session meeting for March 28, 2012 with Sandy Weigt leading devotions



John Knox Presbytery Meeting Highlights

Here are some highlights from the February 18, 2012 Presbytery Meeting:

- > Experienced worship in which Ruling Elder Bonnie Sue Lewis preached and she was installed as Moderator and Teaching Elder Clara Thompson was installed as Vice Moderator.
- > During the Equipping the Saints time Rev. Jill Sanders from the Center for Parish Development introduced the John Knox Presbytery's Missional Journey.
- ➤ During the announcements heard an invitation from Teaching Elder Marilyn Gamm to Dale Heights Presbyterian Church in Madison, WI's 55th anniversary celebration Sunday, April 29, 2012 at 11:00 a.m. Rev. Gamm shared it will be a joint, bi-lingual English-Korean service with the Sah-lang Korean Church to celebrate its 5th anniversary nesting with Dale Heights. Rev. Gamm also reported from the just ended February General Assembly Mission Council meeting that the GAMC is recommending to this summer's General Assembly meeting a new initiative calling for the establishment of 1,001 new worshiping communities in the next 10 years.
- Received the Committee on Ministry report, during which Teaching Elder Marilyn Gamm introduced new Teaching Elder LeAnne Clausen de Montes, new pastor at First Presbyterian Church, Oregon, WI, and approved an Administrative Commission for the purpose of installing Rev. Clausen de Montes as Pastor of the Oregon church; introduced new Teaching Elder Pamela Gnagy, new pastor at Grace Presbyterian Church, Winona, MN; approved Parkside Presbyterian Church, Madison, WI's request to name Teaching Elder Woody Carey Pastor Emeritus; approved having the Stated Clerk request Glacier Presbytery to dismiss Teaching Elder Louis Stoker to John Knox Presbytery and enrolling him as Honorably Retired; approved moving Teaching Elder Lin Grace Rohr from the Member at Large to the Validated Ministry Roll; approved the second reading and adopted an amended revision of the Committee on Ministry section of the John Knox Presbytery By-Laws Section V.C.; approved concurring with the request of Teaching Elder Sandra Nuernberg to dissolve the pastoral relationship with Oakland-Cambridge Presbyterian Church, Cambridge, WI, dismissed with thanks Rev. Nuernberg as Moderator and appointed Teaching Elder Sam Buffat as Moderator, and moved Rev. Nuernberg from the Validated to the Member at Large Roll; approved the appointment of Teaching Elders Sam Buffat, Shirley Funk, Glen Reichelderfer, and Clara Thompson, and Ruling Elders Bruce Barge, Deborah Little Cohn, and Carol Wright to comprise an Administrative Commission with original jurisdiction for Oakland-Cambridge Presbyterian Church until the May 2012 John Knox Presbytery meeting; approved moving Teaching Elder Susan Li from the Validated to the Member at Large Roll; and approved dispensing with the 6-month interval and granting permission to First Presbyterian Church, Cambria, WI to form a Pastor Nominating Committee for the purpose of nominating the Stated Supply Pastor, Teaching Elder Kristin Frederich, as their called and installed Pastor.
- > Received the Presbytery Council report, during which noted the Council's 2012 Action Initiatives; reported various actions taken in behalf of Presbytery including receipt of a \$27,792 gift from First Presbyterian Church, Baraboo, WI; and approved establishing five sites (Portage-Portage, Postville-Community, Presbyterian Church of West Salem, Dubuque-Westminster, and Madison, Covenant) to be equipped with Life Size video conferencing materials at a total cost of \$130,000.
- > Received the Moderator, Executive Presbyter, Treasurer, and Stated Clerk's reports. During the Stated Clerk's report approved Session records reviewed since the November 2012 Presbytery meeting; approved granting First Presbyterian Church, Andrew, IA a waiver for the limitation on terms so that Ruling Elder Wendy Dunne may serve a third consecutive 3-year term on Session; approved the numerical parity of Teaching Elders and Ruling Elders report; and approved the summary of the Annual Statistical Reports to the General Assembly
- The next meeting will be May 15, 2012 at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Dubuque, IA

Smoking is not allowed within our facilities

Air-conditioned facility
In addition to the usual clothing items, bring:
Heavy work boots (lots of dangerous debris) Leather or heavy-duty work gloves
Light-weight cotton gloves
Rain gear
Hat, visor, bandana
Sunglasses

*It is highly recommended that every volunteer have a current tetanus shot.

A limited number of mattresses and air mattresses are currently available; have 30 twin bed frames & mattresses .

A full kitchen with appliances and cooking and eating utensils (no food, but an evening fellowship meal will be provided once a week) Dining area with seating for 40
Two large sleeping rooms; two small sleeping rooms
Two refrigerators and one chest freezer
Large water coolers from which you can fill water bottles
Ice Maker
Washer and dryer w/detergent
Toilet tissue, paper towels, cleaning supplies
Four showers with bath towels and mats, laundered every other day

Entertainment-TV, ping pong, foosball, pool table, outdoor basketball


