History is not the dead past, but the strengths and weaknesses, the people, the stories, the decisions, the concerns that a church body carries from its previous experience. These offer a starting point as well as inspire prayerful reflection about the central questions, "Who do we say we are?" and "What is God is calling us to be and do?"

Come explore our past with us. Enjoy the fellowship, food and sharing.

Property & Finance Committee Meeting Highlights – April 12, 2011

- > Tile repairs have been completed in the dining room and all along the cast wall in fellowship hall
- > Discussed covering the fellowship hall sump pump with a cupboard-like arrangement.
- > Heard the painting/redecorating task force report with plans for cleaning the furniture in the lounge and for making new covers for the metal posts in fellowship hall.
- > Doors of both red and white garages have been repaired or readjusted.
- > Decided to call for an expert assessment into the feasibility and funding possibilities of a home access ramp for one of our parishioners.
- > Referred to session: a request for consultation on the landscaping at the front of the church.
- > Heard report from committee member who attended the most recent City of Madison informational meeting on changes to University Avenue and environs.
- > Signs in memorial gardens need to be checked and some replacements ordered.
- First Spring Work Day will be April 30, 9 am. Limb pruning, leaf cleanup, wedding, and cutting out overly-enthusiastic flowering quince. All help is greatly appreciated.
- Financial report received. As of March 31, 2011, net income was -\$2,052 compared with a budgeted net income of \$0. Three minor adjustments will be made to clean up Balance Sheet categories: transfer \$5 and \$37 from "IHN" and "Field Trips" to General Fund, and transfer \$8 in UNICEF to Crop Walk.
- > The next meeting will be Tuesday, May 10 at 7pm.

Outreach & Mission Committee Meeting Highlights – April 10, 2011

- Continued discussions about supporting the Metzloffs' grandson's Cub Scout troop, and possibly chartering a Girl Scout troop later; approved recommending to Session a Scout Day, perhaps on Father's Day, to raise funds to help two boys purchase their Scout uniforms and go to summer camp
- Approved recommending to Session that the proceeds from the Easter breakfast benefit the Juan Calvino School in Guatemala. supported by Covenant Presbyterian Church
- Continued discussion about a proposal for "growing the pie" for mission funds through a Thanksgiving fund-raising opportunity
- Learned that Gale Oakes will provide the projector for the May 15 potluck program by Middleton Outreach Ministry Executive Director Jackson Fonder
- > Discussed possible ways of helping Frank Woodruff get a handicap ramp into his home
- Discussed ideas for upcoming potluck program speakers, and decided to invite someone from Porchlight in June and from ARC in July
- > The next meeting with be Sunday, May 22 at 11:30 a.m.
