#### Pastor Marilyn's Monthly Musings

#### **News from "Dale Heights East"**

#### an occasional column by Sandy Weigt during her grand-parenting sabbatical in Connecticut

9/30/12: I attended the Sunday service at three different churches in my effort to find a church that would become my church home away from Dale Heights. I hoped to have a "sign" that would point me in the direction of the church I should attend.

The First United Methodist Church has a service most like Dale Heights. Pastor Joe (Chamberland) was at the entrance to the sanctuary when I came in and introduced himself to me. This is an older church building and the pews are separated in the middle. It has a pipe organ. They use the Faith We Sing black hymnal for many of the songs so that was familiar. The children's story time was interesting. A child of the congregation goes home with a brown paper grocery sack and brings it to church on Sunday morning and Pastor Joe bases his children's sermon on what is in the paper bag. The week I visited it was a baseball bat. I think this would be quite a challenge every week (please correct me if I am wrong, Pastor Marilyn). Intercessory Prayer time was like our Joys and Concerns. After each brief joy or concern was expressed, a brief prayer was said by Pastor Joe. Communion was served and we went to kneel at the rail. I was served Communion by Pastor Joe and he remembered my name. This is a talent I think most pastors have. After the dismissal with blessing, everyone stood in a circle around the edge of the sanctuary, held hands, and sang "God Be With you Till we Meet Again." I figured that was a "sign" because that hymn is what I used as my prayer following the devotion at the last Session meeting I went to.

The Stafford Springs Congregational Church service was also quite familiar. Members of the congregation were involved and they went up to the front when it was their turn to do something. Then they went back to their seat. The joys and concerns for their congregation were written on a sheet of paper by the pastor and then after the prayers were said, that sheet of paper went into a box at the front. It was explained that it symbolized the continuing presence of those joys and concerns. Following the Benediction, we sang "God Be With You 'Till We Meet Again." Hmmm. Another "sign"! The passing of the peace also followed that song and included the invitation to go to Fellowship Hall.

The Holy Trinity Lutheran Church service was most foreign to me. The joys and concerns were names called out with no explanation. It is a very close church and I think everyone knows what the joy or concern is. The sermon was appropriate for me since I am trying to find a church to attend in my temporary home of Stafford Springs, CT. It was about getting out of your comfort zone. It was not about worshiping outside your comfort zone but it made me think about where I wanted to worship. I have always felt that you need to worship where you feel comfortable. It is not to say that you should just accept everything that is said, but you should feel comfortable with the worship experience and be able to question what is being said.

I have decided that the Methodist Church is the church I plan to attend while here. I am most comfortable there with the order of service. I went again this morning and was greeted warmly by all who remembered me and made to feel very welcome by all I had not met. The children's sermon this morning was based on what Riley (about a three year old) brought: her favorite acorn.

10/6/12: Elliot has discovered splashing in his bath. Quite an experience, especially for Lisa who gets all wet. Don has arrived for his visit. The trees are really beautiful. I have had three visitors (other than family) and all have said they don't envy me driving here in the winter. Lots of hills. I understand the winters here are milder, but this is the area that was out of power for a couple of weeks last October because of the weather. I'll keep you posted.

#### **Dale Heights Guiding Vision Statement**

Draft # 3: September 19, 2012

#### WE ARE A PEOPLE OF SALT AND LIGHT

Bold in action, resisting despair, advocating for those whose voices go unheard, seeking peaceful resolution rather than escalation of conflict, challenging our culture of materialism with one of contentment and creativity, countering the culture of arrogance with one of humility, we speak into our culture the truths of Jesus Christ. We trust in God's faithfulness, and trust that as a church we are in company with a God that never sleeps.

This faithful God gathers us together in a wide variety of worship opportunities in which we experience and offer reconciliation and hope in a world that desperately yearns for both. We are a place for all to rest when weary, to come and be transformed to our very roots, to learn faith, love and hope, and to radiate these gifts. We are an open-minded and caring church, called to be salt and light in the world through serving people's essential needs, among them food, fellowship and spiritual connection as we continue our tradition of outreach mission projects. We feel called to be a church in and for the neighborhood, an intimate and diverse place where "everybody knows your name."

Jesus commands us to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength—and our neighbors as ourselves. Therefore we claim God's loving acceptance of all as a cornerstone on which we build. All are equal and equally welcomed at Christ's banquet and at our tables. Recognizing Christ with outstretched arms, we seek to stretch our own arms out to the world, embracing all.

We believe that in prayer we encounter an awesome, living God. We pray with the expectation that prayer will move aside all that stands between us and God. Our prayers equip us to live in harmony with one another and with the earth; to accept all, forgive all and live in hope. We believe that through praying and acting we are shining God's light, making a difference in the world. Through our prayerful actions, we are God's loving hands on earth.

As a people of salt and light, we are a gathered and sent community seeking to be faithful witnesses through prayer and action. We look to break the bonds of despair. We say to hopelessness—"begone!"— we are following One who carries hope like a glorious banner for all to see. In a world of doubt and fear we choose to trust and hope.

#### **Session Highlights**

#### September 23, 2012

- During the Clerk of Session report, approved the September 23, 2012 stated Session meeting minutes; approved the October 7, 2012 called Session meeting minutes; noted an error in the Membership corrections to the Clerk's Report made last month, resulting in a total church membership of 69 on December 31, 2011; and learned that as part of the minutes and church rolls review Presbytery Stated Clerk Alyson Janke also offered suggestions for setting up a Session Manual of Operations.
- During the Property & Finance Committee report, heard a brief report on the September and year-to-date financials; reviewed the two paving contractors' bids on replacing the parking lot, and discussed when and who to do the capital campaign to pay for it, establishing tentative plans to begin the campaign in January for an April parking lot replacement project; heard an update on plans for the fall Stewardship Campaign; learned the prices for the winter snow plowing contract are the same as last year; discussed replacing the Lounge carpet with linoleum or tile, adding a recommendation to do the same in the kitchenette off the Concourse; discussed and are recommending getting what is needed for the floor buffer so it is useable again; and heard an update on replacing the sanctuary sound system.
- Received the monthly Pastor's report.
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report learned that children's Church School meeting every other week is not going very well and discussed how having unexpected guest children would be handled; that the Adult Church School is reading *The Problem of Pain* by C.S. Lewis; and that the Lunch & Learn study on Genesis has concluded, that a new study on prayer has been ordered, and that the Advent study for December is in.
- During the Nominating Committee report noted that it will need to meet soon to begin seeking nominees to fill
  two Class of 2015 Ruling Elder openings on Session; and approved calling a Congregational meeting following
  morning worship Sunday, December 9, 2012 for the purpose of electing two Ruling Elders to the Class of 2015,
  electing three persons from the congregation to the 2013 Nominating Committee, and to announce the 2013
  capital campaign to replace the parking lots.
- During the Outreach & Mission Committee report heard and update on Dale Heights serving the Pres House supper October 28; and that there are tentative plans to host a SERRV booth for a potluck in November.
- During the Personnel Committee report learned all employee and volunteer background checks are current; and that employee annual reviews will begin being scheduled soon.
- During the Transformation Team report that the Vision Panel will meet November 1 to consider making additional changes to the draft Guiding Vision Statement; that Coach Clara hopes to meet with the Transformation Team in November; and that there are tentative plans for another suitcase presentation during morning worship on Sunday, November 11.
- During the Worship & Music Committee report learned that Pastor Marilyn and Craig Howard will exchange
  pulpits for morning worship Sunday, October 28, 2012; that the 2013 pledge dedication will be part of the
  Thanksgiving service Sunday, November 18, 2012; and that the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cultural emphasis will
  be Eastern Europe.
- During Miscellaneous Business received information about various configurations of possible neighborhood mailings for future consideration.
- The next stated Session meeting was set for Sunday, November 18, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. with Mike Holland leading devotions.

# Property & Finance Committee Highlights October 12, 2012

- Memorial Gardens: 10 yards bark mulch received and spread. Bulb plantings started.
- Fan motor: squirrel damage fixed for approximately \$325.
- Sound system extension and improvements: 3-part bid received from Sonic for discussion of price, warranty and further maintenance. Bid has been shared with Sah-lang.
- Office entrance concrete repair: accepted bid from K.K. Concrete for \$750 to break up and pour new concrete slab.
- A/C condensate line problems: discussed option of adding two 3' x 2' trap/access doors in concourse ceiling. Cost \$500 plus labor, and requires contractor to ensure work is up to code.
- Thanks to Sah-lang for cleaning hall and concourse carpeting. Discussed lounge flooring—replacing carpeting, using linoleum over entire surface for better wear.
- Parking lots: received bids from Poblocki Paving Company and Tri-County Paving Inc. ranging from \$42,325 to \$52,585. Projected timetable for Spring 2013.
- Snow removal: estimate for winter 2012-13 received and approved.
- Stewardship campaign draft letter read and revised.
- Financial Reports as of 9-30-12 reviewed. Year-to-date, we have a net budgeted income of \$6,223.
- Next meeting: Tuesday, November 13, 7pm.


#### Greetings!
