News from "Dale Heights East"

an occasional column by Sandy Weigt during her grand-parenting sabbatical in Connecticut

I have been a member of Dale Heights Church since 1980. I have visited other churches with friends and family so had an "in" at those churches because of them. It is rather intimidating visiting a church without knowing anyone. My desire to worship with others and to meet other people helped me overcome my concerns. I also wanted to see how I was greeted and I have to say, warm welcomes were given at all three churches I visited.

My first worship experience was at the First United Methodist Church, a large white frame building about a half mile from my apartment. I walked. I was greeted warmly at the door by two men who asked that I sign the guest book. They gave me a "packet" of information about the Methodist Church in general with information specifically about the FUMC. The packet included a copy of the most recent newsletter which I found very informative. I was told where the sanctuary was and was welcomed by a number of people on my way up the steps to the sanctuary. Following worship was coffee hour. I think it must be done by committee because there was a huge variety of food (pie, cake, cookies, chips, dip, pasta salad, cheese crackers). I took some cheese and crackers (made me feel a little like I was in Wisconsin) and made my way to a table with a number of women. Very friendly. Someone came up to me and said "I know you" and we decided we didn't know each other. A good experience.

Second I went to the Congregational Church downtown, about 3/4 of a mile from my apartment. Again, I walked. It is a beautiful stone building. I was a bit early for the service and there were classes somewhere in the building. I was looking around the entrance and a woman who reminded me of Trudi came and greeted me and gave me a bulletin. I signed the guest book and sat down. Prior to the service, the pastor, Hector Mendez, walked up and down the aisle talking to everyone, including me. He also said "I know you" so I must have a twin in this area. Wonder if I will meet her. All visitors were acknowledged by name during the service. There were four visitors in a group of about 40. Coffee hour was again a large variety of food and conversation. I was not able to stay too long because I had a play date with Elliot so Matt could do some studying.

This past Sunday I went to the Lutheran Church about a quarter mile from my apartment. I walked. It is identified as "Slovak" and is affiliated with the ELCA. My neighbor, Chris, was the greeter. The service is pretty much outlined in the hymnal with the bulletin indicating what pages to turn to. Chris went through the service with me in the bulletin prior to the service and it was a real help. He also sat with me part of the time. They all knew what was going on but not me. They had a passing of the peace where it seemed that everyone greeted everyone. They did not have a coffee hour so the passing of the peace was pretty much their social time.

Anyway, all churches I visited were very welcoming. I think every church had some kind of meeting following worship, but it did not take away from including me in their fellowship. It is a comfort to know that I will feel at home when I decide which church I will attend.

I would recommend everyone visit another church where you don't know anyone. I have not done this for more than 30 years and my experience has been that the Christian Community is a warm and welcoming one, just like Dale Heights was when I first visited and continues to be. It also makes me appreciate knowing I have a place called Dale Heights to call my home church.

Elliot continues to be a real joy to be around. He is so close to crawling, Guess I will grow with that when he does. Apparently he is showing real interest in electrical outlets. Hmmm. I hope he gets into the cat food the first time while Lisa or Matt is watching him rather than me.

The current revised Guiding Vision Statement is below. It is also posted along with the first version on the Vision Wall in the Concourse, and will be used in worship periodically in October. We are grateful for your continued thoughts and reflections as you interact with the revised Draft, and for your active participation as we look for where God is leading Dale Heights on this exciting journey as a people of God.

Draft # 3: September 19, 2012

WE ARE A PEOPLE OF SALT AND LIGHT

Bold in action, resisting despair, advocating for those whose voices go unheard, seeking peaceful resolution rather than escalation of conflict, challenging our culture of materialism with one of contentment and creativity, countering the culture of arrogance with one of humility, we speak into our culture the truths of Jesus Christ. We trust in God's faithfulness, and trust that as a church we are in company with a God that never sleeps.

This faithful God gathers us together in a wide variety of worship opportunities in which we experience and offer reconciliation and hope in a world that desperately yearns for both. We are a place for all to rest when weary, to come and be transformed to our very roots, to learn faith, love and hope, and to radiate these gifts. We are an open-minded and caring church, called to be salt and light in the world through serving people's essential needs, among them food, fellowship and spiritual connection as we continue our tradition of outreach mission projects. Jesus commands us to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength—and our neighbors as ourselves. Therefore we claim God's loving acceptance of all as a cornerstone on which we build. Session Highlights

September 23, 2012

- During the Clerk of Session report, approved the August 19, 2012 stated Session meeting minutes; approved the September 16, 2012 called Congregation meeting minutes; and approved Membership corrections to the Clerk's Report in the 2009, 2010 and 2011 Annual Congregational Meeting Reports, resulting in a total church membership of 68 on December 31, 2011
- During the Property & Finance Committee report, heard a brief report on the August and year-to-date
 financials; heard updates on various new and continuing projects; expressed concern about the lounge
 and Concourse carpeting that it needs replaced; learned that two paving contractors have been
 contacted to bid on replacing the parking lot, and that one of those bids is in; heard an update on plans
 for the fall Stewardship Campaign; heard an update on replacing the sanctuary sound system, including
 that one bid has been received and another is being sought; and heard an update on the church
 redecorating projects
- Received the monthly Pastor's report
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report learned that children's Church School is meeting every other week until there are more children; that the Adult Church School is reading *The Problem of Pain* by C.S. Lewis; and that the Lunch & Learn study on Genesis will wrap up in October
- During the Nominating Committee report welcomed newly elected and installed Ruling Elder Bill Mercer back onto Session; and noted that it will need to meet soon to begin seeking nominees to fill two Class of 2015 Ruling Elder openings on Session
- During the Outreach & Mission Committee report learned that promotion of the Peacemaking Offering is underway; that the CROP Walk is October 21; that Dale Heights serves the Pres House supper October 28; and that there are tentative plans to host a SERRV booth for a potluck in November
- During the Personnel Committee report learned all employee and volunteer background checks are current; and that employee annual reviews will begin being scheduled soon
- During the Transformation Team report reviewed an abridged draft of the Guiding Vision Statement, and requested that the Vision Panel consider making one more change to it; and approved calling a Session meeting for October 7, 2012 with the Transformation Team and Coach Clara for her to lead the Session through the setting Key Result Areas process
- During the Worship & Music Committee report learned that the World Communion Sunday service will be a joint one with the Sah-lang Church on October 7, 2012 at 11 a.m.; that Pastor Marilyn and Craig Howard will exchange pulpits for morning worship Sunday, October 28, 2012; that the 2013 pledge dedication will be part of the Thanksgiving service Sunday, November 18, 2012; and that the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cultural emphasis will be Eastern Europe
- The next stated Session meeting was set for Sunday, October 21, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. with Gerry Klump leading devotions

Property & Finance Committee Highlights September 11, 2012

- The financial report for January August of 2012 shows the total income received is at \$98,299 and the total amount expended is at \$92,348. There are three points of interest about these figures. First is that the estimated amount of total income used for the calendar year 2012 operating budget is \$147,484 and after eight months, or 66.7% of the year, the \$98,299 received to-date equates to 66.7% of the total estimated income for the year. We are right on track to meet the planned income level. Second, despite the heat, and greater use of the air conditioners, our year-to-date expenses are at 62.6% of the total planned budget of \$147,484. And third, having more income year-to-date than expenses gives a positive variance of \$5,951 but with frost having visited already, we know the heating and snow plowing bills over the next four months will reduce this "surplus." Stay tuned.
- Cement Work: the cement slab in front of the office door needs repair or replacement. One bid for \$750 to do a replacement was received. Additional review of repair options will be done this month.
- Parking Lot: two estimates have been requested for resurfacing the parking lot, The estimates are expected later this month.
- Carpets: options for cleaning, repairs and replacement are being investigated.
- Stewardship: the first draft of a Fall Stewardship letter that will be sent to members and friends for Dale Heights was read and discussed. Committee members will review and share thoughts and suggestions at the next meeting. Again, stay tuned.
- Next meeting is likely to be Thursday October 11th at 7:00 p.m. Normally the Property and Finance Committee meets the second Tuesday of the month but Pastor Marilyn is not available for October 8th. Once again, please stay tuned.

Worship & Music Committee Highlights August 29, 2012

- Learned that September 9 is Casual Sunday, with a "Welcome Back" potluck commemorating the beginning of fall Church School and Choir.
- Pastor Marilyn will arrange a pulpit exchange with Craig and will coordinate it with the Concourse service which is being planned for October or November.
- Pulpit supply for November 25 is Sam Buffat.
- October 7, World Communion Sunday, has been confirmed as a joint service with Sah-lang. Communion will be served using international breads.
- The annual stewardship emphasis will probably be October 28, November 4 and November 11, with the pledge dedication as part of our Thanksgiving communion service on November 18.
- Cultural emphasis for Advent-Christmas-Epiphany will be Eastern European countries.
- Communion will be held on October 7, November 4, November 18, and December 2.
- Tom Jones is scheduling communion servers, ushers, and a greeter at the front door. First Sunday liturgists will come down and help serve communion. Reintroducing the use of name tags tabled.
- Maggie acquired a few new pices for the choir this year from her attendance at the American Guild of Organists annual convention.
- Next meeting will be held November 11, 2012.
