Having received the Guiding Vision Draft from the Vision Panel in June, the Transformation Coordinating Team has provided a number of opportunities for the congregation to interact with the Draft during the summer months. Thank you to all of you who have participated in the opportunities provided, and we are grateful for your continued thoughts and reflections as you interact with the Draft! The Transformation Coordinating Team will meet in mid-September to share what we have learned from the congregation. Again, thank you for your active participation as we look for where God is leading Dale Heights on this exciting journey as a people of God.



#### **Session Highlights**

#### August 19, 2012

- During the Clerk of Session report, approved the July 15, 2012 state Session meeting minutes; reported that the Stated Clerk has set the annual Session records review opportunities for this September and October
- During the Property & Finance Committee report, heard a brief report on the July and year-to-date financials; conducted the annual review of insurance coverage; rescinded the July motion asking that in the next budget cycle a line item be added for hiring outside contractors to do some needed maintenance projects with the funds to come either from the operating budget or memorial funds; approved a motion to authorize the Pastor and the Property & Finance Chair to jointly approve spending up to \$1,000 for projects that need immediate attention without Session approval; approved a motion to request the Property & Finance Committee to contact an outside contractor to assess and bid on improving access to the Concourse air conditioning unit; approved a motion expressing appreciation to Dick Corey on donating and to Dick and Harold Meyer for installing an air conditioning unit in the MATC classroom; learned which two contractors will be asked to bid on replacing the parking lots; learned that the fall Stewardship Campaign is being planned; heard an update on replacing the sanctuary sound system; and heard an update on the church redecorating projects
- Received the monthly Pastor's report
- During the Care & Fellowship Committee report learned that the new co-chairs are Edi Chan and Vreni Straubhaar
- During the Christian Education Ministry Team report learned that children's Church School will meet every other week until there are more children; that there is one person interested in going through confirmation class; and discussed what kind of Christmas pageant to have this year
- During the Nominating Committee report approved calling a congregational meeting following worship Sunday, September 16, 2012 to elect a Ruling Elder to Session to fill a two-year unexpired term, with the person elected to be installed during worship Sunday, September 23, 2012
- During the Outreach & Mission Committee report heard a report about from Halfway Through the Road Construction Ice Cream Social for the Neighborhood; that the next meeting is September 16; that the potluck program speakers will be from Pres House on September 23; and that plans are underway to promote the Peacemaking Offering in September
- During the Personnel Committee report learned all employee and volunteer background checks are current; that Rick Shannon is the new chair; and that Edi Chan is a new member
- During the Transformation Team report learned that the next training is September 22, 2012
- During the Worship & Music Committee report learned that the August meeting has been rescheduled for August 29, 2012
- During miscellaneous business, received the August 18, 2012 John Knox Presbytery meeting report
- The next Session meeting was set for Sunday, September 23, 2012 at 6:00 p.m. with Kim Chan leading devotions

# Property & Finance Committee Highlights August 14, 2012

- Gardens: seven replacement plaques will be ordered for those missing. A stone memorial for the front of the large garden will be ordered from Plaque Master. The inscription will read "Shirley-Dawn Jorgenson Memorial Garden, Dale Heights Presbyterian Church." Spring-flowering bulbs have been selected for planting in the Todd Memorial Garden. Discussed how to keep the box elders from shading out the Colorado Blue Spruce trees.
- Work days: Weeding and mulch spreading set for September 8, 9am. Prior to that date, 10 yards of oak bark mulch will be ordered. Broken window in Fellowship Hall will also be tended to.
- Redecorating task force presented the second "welcome" banner. Fellowship stairwell spackling and painting were discussed.
- A/C condensate line appears to be cleared—no leaking since earlier this summer. A future necessity: to make the ceiling A/C area more accessible, facilitating regular condensate line flushing with bleach.
- Lounge carpet: contact will be made with Dan the Carpet Man to request drawing out the bubbles in the current carpet and giving an estimate for the carpet's replacement.
- Hard surfaces: request from session for two estimates for parking lot resurfacing. Session, too, may approach
  someone for a bid. Brennans has been contacted about asphalt sidewalk/steps plans. Sah-lang church will do what
  they can to assist with parking lot costs. Still to come: estimate for concrete flat work to repair/replace crumbling
  pad in front of church office entrance.
- Stewardship: stewardship sermons are scheduled for October 28, November 4, and November 11. Pledges will be dedicated on November 11. A draft stewardship letter will be prepared before the next Finance committee meeting.
- From Session: a request that next year's 2013 budget include a line item for covering as-needed maintenance that volunteers are not able to provide. Finance Committee is asking session to provide a dollar figure. In a related matter, discussion of raising the dollar amount for expenditures requiring session approval. Currently, any unbudgeted expenditure over \$500 must have session approval.
- Insurance: reviewed the Guide One (Des Moines IA) and Lee Insurance (Muscatine IA) policy renewal information. Total cost has gone down around \$50. Pastor Marilyn earlier filled out a detailed questionnaire from Guide One and had sent them a copy of our church poly on "safe sanctuary."
- Thanks! Received from sewing teachers and students who appreciated the new mobile A/C unit during the recordbreaking heat.
- Financial reports reviewed for period ending July 31, 2012. Year-to-date net budgeted income is \$6,105.
- Next meeting Tuesday, September 11, 2012, 7:00 pm.



#### John Knox Presbytery Meeting Highlights

Here are some highlights from the August 18, 2012 Meeting:

Met for the first time via video conferencing at five sites around the Presbytery: Covenant – Madison, WI, Westminster – Dubuque, IA, Community – Postville, IA, West Salem – West Salem, WI and First – Portage – Portage, WI.

Honored Stated Clerk Alyson Janke with a surprise recognition of her having received the C. Fred Jenkins Constitutional Services Award during the 220<sup>th</sup> General Assembly meeting.

Participated in an Equipping the Saints time of study and worship.

During the Announcements received a thank you for those churches and pastors who participated in Dale Heights Presbyterian Church, Madison, WI's recent English book collection for a South Korean church.

Approved By Laws and Manual of Operation revisions from the Commissioned Ruling Elder Committee, the Committee on Ministry, the Committee on Preparation for Ministry, the Ethics Policy, the Nominating Committee, the Personnel Committee, and Presbytery Operations.

Received the Committee on Ministry report, during which noted the Presbytery's minimum effective salary for 2013 is \$39,975 and for 2014 is \$40,500; approved the proposed Administrative Commission to install Teaching Elder Craig Howard as Pastor of Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church, Cottage Grove, WI on Sunday, September 30, 2012 at 1:00 p.m.; examined, approved and commissioned Brenda Pulver to serve as Commissioned Ruling Elder to First Presbyterian Church, Oxford, WI and First Presbyterian Church, Packwaukee, WI; and approved granting COM the authority to waive the ordination exams of a Presbyterian Church of Korea member to so that the minister will be eligible to serve as pastor of the Korean Presbyterian Church of Madison, WI, if the way be clear.

Received reports from 220<sup>th</sup> General Assembly Teaching Elder Commissioners Shirley Funk and Craig Howard, Ruling Elder Allen Hanson, and Young Adult Advisory Delegate Evangeline Smith.

Received an update on and encouragement to participate in the Presbyterian Mission Agency's 1,001 New Worshiping Communities initiative – see <a href="http://www.onethousandone.org">http://www.onethousandone.org</a> for more information and resources.

Received the Nominating Committee report, during which elected Ruling Elder Herb Damsteegt and Teaching Elder Mark Achtemeier to the COM, and Teaching Elder Julie Waterdu to the Personnel Committee.

Received the Oakland-Cambridge Presbyterian Church, Cambridge, WI Administrative Commission report.

Received the Commissioned Ruling Elder Committee report that it has approved Ruling Elder Mathew Decker as a Seeker.

Received the Committee on Preparation for Ministry report, during which approved enrolling Evan Stark and Alicia Maxwell as Inquirers, and approved Teaching Elders Tim Gerarden and Kristen Rick as readers for the Standard Ordination Exams.

Received the Presbytery Council report, during which approved the 2013 Budget of \$336,624.00; approved setting the Presbytery's 2013 per capita at \$16.25, noting the Synod per capita will be \$5.00 and the GA per capita will be \$6.80, for a total 2013 per capita of \$28.05; approved retaining the Shared Mission Pledge percentages in 2013; elected Ruling Elders Tom Iverson and Jerry Miller, and Teaching Elder Cindy Arndt to the Nominating Committee; and approved setting aside the Bylaws to allow the following changes in 2012 and 2013 Presbytery meeting dates: November 10, 2012 at LaCrosse-First for consideration of Amendments, February 16, 2013 via video conference; May 21, 2013 at TBA, August 20, 2013 via video conference, and November 9, 2013 at TBA.

Received the Personnel Committee report, during which approved new terms of call for Executive Presbyter Ken Meunier; and noted Presbytery Administrator Judy Crostenberg's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of service to JKP.

Received the Executive Presbyter, Treasurer, and Stated Clerk's reports. During the Stated Clerk's Report received a request to make sure Clerks of Session received the Meetings Reviewing Session Records fall schedule; thanked the Presbytery for its expressions of congratulations on her award and recognized her predecessor Stated Clerks: Ray W. G. Bayley, E. John Harle, and Duncan Brockway; and reported having received a written accusation against a Teaching Elder member of the Presbytery, and that an Investigative Committee has been appointed by the Presbytery Moderator.

The next meeting will be Saturday, November 10, 2012 at First Presbyterian Church, LaCrosse, WI.
